I George Thoms Master of His Majesty's ship Lucifer and considering the perils of the seas and other uncertainties of life So for avoiding controversies after my decease make this my last will and testament and I give and bequeath unto my friends Samuel Denton and Issac Clementson of London Navy Agents all my pay arrears of pay prize money and all and every other sum and sums of money that shall or may be due unto me at the time of my decease from the Treasurer or Pay Master of His Majestys Navy the Paymaster or Agent of the Marines for the time being or from any other agent or agents of prizes and from all other person or persons whatsoever and also all the rest residue and remainder of my worldly goods estate and effects whatsoever and the said Samuel Denton and Isaac Clementson shall first reimburse themselves all such sum and sums of money as I shall or may happen to be indebted to them and being so reimbursed shall afterwards without delay shall pay the overplus of all such monies and effects so received or to be received if any overplus shall be unto my dearly beloved wife Margaret Thoms in Aberdeen North Britain or to any other person or persons authorised by me to receive the same to whom the said Samuel Denton and Isaac Clementson shall receive a true account of all such monies and effects within three months after such account shall be demanded and so I nominate the said Samuel Denton and Isaac Clementson and my wife Margaret Thoms Executors of my said will in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the fifth day of February in the year of our sons One
